

Recreation, lodging and restaurant info near the Green & Nolin Rivers Blueway:

- The proximity of Mammoth Cave National Park to all river locations, provides option of seeing the world's longest cave - which many river users do during their trip
- Camping is available near all river access locations - there are 12 campgrounds within 30 miles of the Blueway.
- Hiking, bicycling, and equestrian trails are nearby all access points. There are 95 miles of trails in the Mammoth Cave National Park. There are also 4 miles of mountain biking trails at Nolin River Lake.
- Boating and other lake recreational opportunities are available at Nolin River Lake and Barren River Lake. Annual visitation of these two lakes reaches nearly 4 million annually.
- Mammoth Cave National Park and the rural landscape around it offer several options for scenic drives.
- The Blueway is close to two U.S. Bike Routes. USBR23 has 109 miles in Kentucky that runs from the southern border of the state to Hodgenville, Kentucky, home of Abraham Lincoln's Birthplace National Historic Site. The 78.6 mile Mammoth Cave Loop of the Transamerica Bike Route also swoops into the Blueway area.
- Lodging near the Blueway includes: cabins, home rentals, hotels, motels, as well as Bed and Breakfasts
- A variety of food options are available near all Blueway access points. These include a variety of chain fast food, as well as many individual owned restaurants.
- Attractions within 30 miles include: Hidden River Cave, Kentucky Down Under, Diamond Caverns, Dinosaur World, Kentucky Action Park, Adventures of Mammoth Cave, National Corvette Museum, Beech Bend Park, Lost River Cave, Historic RailPark, Barren River Lake, and Nolin Lake State Park
- There are four Kentucky Department of Tourism designated Trail Towns nearby: Munfordville, Cave City/Horse Cave, Brownsville and Park City.
- Nearby small towns & communities to explore also include: Glasgow, Smiths Grove, Uno, Pig, Cub Run
